






Multicultural Day - Celebrating our School's Cultural Diversity in Harmony

Opportunity class – a webinar for parents of Year 4 students Wednesday, 3 April 2024 7:00 pm – 8:00 pm AEDT

If your child is currently in Year 4, you may wish to apply for placement in an opportunity class for Year 5 entry in 2025. You can find out more about the application and placement process by attending our webinar about opportunity classes on Wednesday, 3 April.

Opportunity classes are one of the ways that the NSW Department of Education provides support for high potential and intellectually gifted students.

Many public primary schools across NSW offer <u>opportunity classes</u>. Students living in rural and remote areas can also apply for a place at Aurora College, which provides online opportunity classes at approximately 600 host schools.

High potential and gifted students are supported across all NSW public high schools through the High Potential and Gifted Education policy.

Applications open on 4 April and close Monday 20 May 2024

Free Kids Dental

It has come to my attention that there may have been some confusion regarding a dental service being offered for free to our students outside the school gate yesterday afternoon. Please be aware that this service has not been approved by myself nor is it affiliated with CSPS in any way.

While we understand the importance of dental care for our children, it's crucial that any services offered to them are vetted and approved by the appropriate authorities. As such, we encourage you to exercise caution and discretion when considering this service for your child's dental needs.

We are committed to the well-being and safety of our students, and we will continue to prioritise their health by ensuring that any services provided within our school community meet the necessary standards and regulations.

Afternoon Gates

This is an important safety measure regarding our school gates and after-school activities.

We kindly request that <u>all</u> parents and guardians ensure their children leave the school premises promptly by <u>**3:30 PM**</u>. This is crucial for the safety and well-being of our students.

Playing on the equipment after school hours poses certain risks, and we want to prevent any accidents or injuries that may occur. Additionally, we need to maintain a safe and orderly environment for all students and staff.

We would also like to remind parents that starting immediately, Team Kids after-school care will not be unlocking gates for families unless their child is in their care. This decision is necessary to ensure the smooth operation of their program and to maintain the proper student educator ratio.

We understand the importance of allowing children to play and socialise, but we must prioritise their safety above all else. We appreciate your cooperation and understanding in this matter.

Attendance

We are noticing a higher number of students coming into school after the bell and <u>not</u> collecting a late pass from the office. These students are being marked absent, unless they collect a late pass. Our Home School Liaison Officer (HSLO) has been monitoring CSPS attendance including partials and lateness. Attendance matters, arriving late means your child has missed the opportunity to settle into class and understand instructions for the mornings literacy session.

Our School's commitment to Reading Improvement

We are excited to share with you the latest developments in our ongoing commitment to enhancing literacy education at Canterbury South Public School Recently the Grattan Institute released a comprehensive reading report, outlining key recommendations for improving literacy outcomes in schools. We are pleased to inform you that our school is actively pursuing these recommendations o further enrich our literacy programs. Many of the recommendations made have been part of our English programs since 2022. Initiatives include targeted professional development for our teaching staff, the implementation of evidence-based reading strategies in the classroom and the incorporation of new resources to supply literacy development. In addition, all students in Years 1-6 have recently participated in a YORK reading assessment with their teacher. This assessment aimed to identify individual strengths and areas for growth in reading comprehension. Our dedicated teachers are eager to share these valuable insights with you during the upcoming scheduled Parent-Teacher-Student conferences in Week 11. These conferences provide an excellent opportunity for collaborative discussions on how we can collectively support each student's reading journey. As we embark on this literacy focused journey together, we look forward to your active participation and support in helping your child reach their reading goals.
