## Reports

Teachers have been working hard on student academic reports for Semester 2 ready to go home on Thursday 10 December.

As you know, student academic reports in Semester 1 were different this year due to Covid and to support the learning completed at home. This semester we have keep the format of the report consistent for families, however, you will notice that there is also an overall grade for Achievement. This was a mandatory inclusion by the Department for Semester 2 reports.

I want to make it very clear that the overall achievement grade is a grade given to each student based on assessment data collected and teacher professional judgement. This grade is for the entire subject for the semester.

The stage indicators you see for each of the Key Learning Areas have been selected as part of the curriculum content that has been taught this semester, not all indicators. The ticks indicate whether your child has achieved that subject indicator or is learning to master it.

I have attached a table that aligns the grade with a mark. At Canterbury South we know each child is an individual and we encourage and assist each child to achieve success.

- A The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.
- B The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.
- C The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.
- D The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a limited level of competence in the processes and skills.
- E The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.
