





Enhancing Reading Skills

We would like to share with you the insightful analysis of the Annual ACER PAT test for Reading, Mathematics, and Spelling conducted for students in Years 2-6. The comprehension data in particular provided valuable insights into the strengths and areas of improvement for our students.

1. What we noticed:

- *Interpreting Explicit Information:* Our students displayed proficiency in interpreting explicit information, showcasing a solid foundation in comprehension skills.
- Retrieving Directly Stated Information: There needs to be a focus on improving the skill of retrieving directly stated information, ensuring students excel in addressing simpler questions effectively.
- Overreliance on Visuals: We observed that some students tend to rely heavily on visuals rather than engaging with the textual content. To address this, we will emphasise the importance of reading the information thoroughly to answer questions.
- English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EAL/D) Students: A significant number of EAL/D students participated in the test. Special attention will be given to cater to their unique needs in comprehension tasks.

3. Actionable Steps:

- Encouraging Home Reading: We encourage parents to foster a reading culture at home.
 Providing passages that require comprehension, initiating discussions and asking questions will enhance students' overall comprehension skills.
- *Embedding Comprehension Skills:* Comprehension skills are embedded into our K-6 curriculum, ensuring that students engage with and understand the text more deeply.

- Explicit Reading and Comprehension Tasks: Students will participate in explicit reading and comprehension tasks in small groups, facilitating a more targeted approach to improving their skills.
- Building Reading Stamina: Recognising the need for increased reading stamina, students will be encouraged to read more consistently, particularly longer texts. This will be incorporated into their nightly homework routine.
- Borrow from our School Library Regularly: Our library is filled with a diverse selection of special interest books that cater to various tastes and preferences. We urge students to make it a habit to access this valuable resource each week. By regularly borrowing from the school library, students not only broaden their knowledge but also discover the joy of exploring different subjects and genres.

We believe that by implementing these strategies, we can collectively enhance the overall comprehension skills of our students. Your support and collaboration are invaluable as we work towards providing the best learning experience for our students. Thank you for your ongoing partnership in our shared commitment to reading excellence.





Scripture

Scripture at CSPS starts in Week 5 (Thursday 29 February). This year we have made a change to the times Scripture will start and end to maximise our in-class teaching time as much as possible.

The new times will be:

9.15 - 9.45am for 3-6 students

9.45 - 10.15am for K-2 students

Students in Years 3-6 are expected to be at school on time, drop their bags off and go straight to allocated Scripture rooms on the bell. Should your child (in Years 3-6) be late on a Thursday, please follow the correct procedure and collect a late pass from the office before going straight to Scripture.

Over the past few years we have seen a decline in key indicators of student wellbeing from our Tell Them from Me student survey responses.

This survey has allowed us to measure and understand the factors that are known to have direct and profound impacts on our student learning and wellbeing. With this information we are able to make evidence-based school planning decisions with confidence about critical topics such as student engagement, mental health, school safety and inclusivity, and many others.

This year CSPS will be participating in The Resilience Project program, a program that delivers emotionally engaging activities and provides evidence-based, practical wellbeing strategies to build resilience.

The program will focus on three key pillars proven to cultivate positive emotion; Gratitude, Empathy and Mindfulness (GEM).

We will refer to this as the GEM project.

I would like to thank the 2023 P&C committee for contributing \$5000 toward this program. Parents have been asked, as part of their fees to pay \$20 for the student workbook. The school will be subsidising the remaining amount.

Every child in every class is expected to participate. Our decision to embark on this whole school initiative means that lessons across the school will be delivered at the same time every Thursday after Scripture starting next week.

Parent will also have an opportunity to engage when the parent information becomes available and accessible.

Basketball

All students in K-6 will participate in 4 x 45 minute sessions with coaches from Bankstown Bruins Basketball every Friday. Students will learn various basketball techniques, such as dribbling, shooting and passing.

- Newtown High School of the Performing Arts is a specialist performing arts high school
 providing the highest level of education to students with outstanding potential and/or
- providing the ingless level of education to students with outstanding potential and/or achievement in Dance, Drama and Music.

 Newtown High School of the Performing Arts has specific enrolment criteria which requires students to audition, if residing outside our catchment area, via online application. All students, including those from within our local catchment area are encouraged, although not obliged, to audition for places in our performing arts stream via the online application process which is separate to an Expression of Interest from provided to parents from their regiment schools. from their primary schools.
- The closing date for audition applications online is Wednesday 1 May 2024.

To be eligible to apply, candidates must be Australian Citizens or holders of a visa granting permanent resident status in Australia on the day of their audition.
